It has been suggested that the large rampart that lies just to the north-west of the site originated in the late Iron Age as a defensive work that cut off the promontory to the south-east, now mostly occupied by the Castle and the medieval town, that was otherwise defended by natural scarps (such as the 'Rampart' shown on the 1971 Ordnance Survey map). If this is the case, the proposed development would lie in the extreme west corner of a significant defended enclosure, where deposits of archaeological interest might be expected.

In the circumstances, whilst there is no known archaeological reason to object to the proposed development, the site should be evaluated by trial trenching beforehand in order to identify structures or deposits of importance that might be affected and to enable appropriate measures to preserve their significance. This process should be secured via the imposition of a suitable standard condition, e.g. a version of ARC1 as follows:

No development shall take place until the applicant has secured the implementation of a programme of archaeological work in accordance with a written scheme of investigation which has been submitted by the applicant and approved by the Planning Authority.
