Proposal: Crown reduction to 1no. ash tree (T1) to leave a height of 16m and spread of 11m. This tree is in the Angmering conservation area.

Location: Gothic House, High Street, Angmering, BN16 4AH

I undertook a desktop review on 1st December 2025, which was adequate for me to determine this Town & Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended) s211 Notice.

I am satisfied this work will not result in harm to the character or appearance of the conservation area, if undertaken to a high standard and at the right time.

Conclusion

I raise **No Objection** and see no reason to make a Tree Preservation Order.

Recommended INFORMATIVE: Hard pruning creates numerous and/or large wounds, incurring a physiological stress which may affect long-term health and vitality. The optimum time to prune ash is spring (late) to summer.
