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Hi Jonny and planning dept, My re: OWPC80060

Just to clarify I have submitted a comment objecting to the planning application for 5 The Cottrells. The main issue I will have is a depletion of natural light to my property due to the extension wall which is planned to go up above my existing fence by an additional 1.2metres. I have already verified that I had spent a lot of money in trying to enhance the natural light in my North facing cottage style house by having french doors fitted and a larger window at the side. However I would not change the actual structure of the house due to the property being terraced and having limited space to do so.

Having a wall that runs down approximately 4 metres from my french doors that is over a metre taller than my fence will create a darkened corridor that will deplete light to both my kitchen and my living room. My total downstairs living space will be negatively affected. This will also potentially devalue my property.

I am just detailing a little bit more how this would affect my limited downstairs living space which is already really quite dark already! Also the wall will be visible from my living area.I will see it from the sofa.
