Thank you for your application which was received on 15th March 2021. I am writing to acknowledge that it was accepted as a valid application on 30th March 2021. The Council aims to make as many decisions as possible before the end of the statutory determination period, which in this case will be 25th May 2021. However, this is not always possible for a number of

reasons, including on-going negotiations or the scheduling of Development Control Committees.

If you have not received a decision by 25th May 2021 or agreed in writing to extend the time in which the Council make a decision, you have 6 months in which to appeal to the Secretary of State. Your appeal (under Section 78 of the Town & Country Planning Act 1990) would be that the Council has failed to make a decision and you would be asking a Government Planning Inspector to make the decision instead. You can do this on a form which you can get from the Planning Inspectorate, Temple Quay House, 2 The Square, Temple Quay, Bristol, BS1 6PN or from the Planning Inspectorate:

If you allow the Council extra time to make a decision on your application, and you disagree with the decision, you will still be able to appeal within 6 months from the date the decision was issued.
