Description of works: Erection of 1 No 1-bedroom self build house with associated parking & private outdoor amenity space. This application is in CIL Zone 4 and is CIL Liable as a new dwelling.

Thank you for your internet representation made on 16th January 2026 which has been recorded as an objection with the comments as follows:

OWPC80937

The plot is too small and the wrong shape to accommodate a house and private garden. The development would be too cramped and would damage the character of nearby properties and gardens.

The small size of the plot means the garden depth approx 3 metres would fail to meet the recommendations of the Arun Design Guide of 10.5 metres. This tiny sunken amenity space would be bounded on 3 sides by a 1.8 metre fence and the north elevation of the house meaning the sunken garden would be in perpetual shade.

The development would be detrimental to the residential amenities of adjacent homes. It would be too close to 28/30 Brook Lane, approx 5 metres. The east elevation runs almost parallel to my garden (party) wall and will be overbearing and mean a loss of open outlook from our home and garden. All we would see would be a rendered wall and a tiled roof.

I am extremely concerned that the plans also show a 1.8 meter high fence at the northern boundary adjoining our "right of way" driveway. The plans show that this runs right up to the edge of The Grove. This creates an extremely dangerous junction for us exiting our parking area and joining The Grove as we would have no visibility to our left at this pinch point in the road. This would affect our safety and the safety of other drivers and pedestrians.

Finally, I am concerned that the plans indicate that the property and garden will be "sunk" to reduce the height of the house. What assurance will there be that this will not have a detrimental effect on our adjoining garden (party) wall, our patio, the driveway, and the junction with The Grove.

Your views as made above will be considered before the application is determined.

Please be aware that Planning Services operate an 'open file' policy and will publish your comments including your name and address on the website.
