Please see below for my comments on the planning application: P/114/24/RES.

The reasons for not allowing this planning application are the same as all the others of this type that have been put forward and not agreed with in this area.

Now and in the future, the land is extremely useful and valuable as agricultural land and as a habitat for many species of wildlife, including IUCN red listed species. This will be obliterated forever if housing is built there.

As a flood plain, the water table in Pagham is already overflowing. This has happened exactly as previous developers were warned against, before building other housing developments in the area. This disrupts existing local amenities for residents and habitats for wildlife.

The resulting extra daily footfall on to the site of RSPB Pagham Harbour, (SPA, RAMSAR, SSSI, MCZ etc.) especially by dog walkers and cyclists, will be detrimental to the wildlife that lives and migrates through the area.

Listed buildings are also detrimentally affected by flooding and excessive building in the area locally. This results in a negative change to the character of the area, that currently supports local businesses and environmental organisations.

Other amenities in the area, such as roads and sewage works are overused due to the amount of people living in the area already. The effects of this are pollution that is detrimental to the health of local people and the environment. Doctors and other health services are overstretched, and schools are oversubscribed, meaning those already living and working here receive a lesser service than they should.

We do not need any more housing developments in this area. Again, the government is taking a very short-sighted approach to the housing situation, locally and nationwide. I would suggest an entirely different approach to this issue: one that assesses use of current houses in the area and makes these (second) homeowners put them up for sale or rent to local people, especially keyworkers, at a reasonable price. I know of several that are out of use for most of the year, as the owners use them as holiday homes for only a few weeks. This is a completely unsustainable model for housing, throughout the country, and should be ended immediately.

Brownfield sites should also be redeveloped instead of using farmland. There are also several of these in the area that are neglected and underused, while valuable farmland is being concreted over for the satisfaction of politicians. (No doubt the pockets of some are being lined in the process). Those that have no clue about the population they are supposed to be serving and the environment they are supposed to be stewards of.

I would be grateful if the government would take an improved and wider-viewed stance on this matter and not just adopt the same quick fix approach it has always done.
