Thank you for your internet representation made on 21st January 2025 which has been recorded as an objection with the comments as follows:

I have lived at 4 New Cottages for 17 years this coming April. I have had several awful times with flooding, from the flood water being swept by traffic into our road from The Street, the Barrack Row Cottages flooded with some residents having to move out and one cottage taking 6 months to repair...at that time a canoe was paddling around our road and on The Street and to get outside I had to wear wellington boots, some water I could hear going under my house but mid calf deep when I had to go outside, scary and awful. Some of my neighbours did experience flooding into their homes. This last years flooding closed off Barnham Lane for weeks, it became a river for a while, and caused flooding here in the garden. I had Southern Water out on two occasions and they did there best to work out what was causing these major problems. Our drains were blocked by the levels of the main sewer in The Street which cannot cope with the volume of sewage entering. This meant that sewage flowed into back gardens, especially my neighbours in Nos 1 and 2 as they join the sewage from Barrack Cottages, as mine is at the start of our 4 homes drains and goes through my neighbours at No3 as theirs does also to No's 1 and 2. This meant we could not flush our toilets for a while and minimising the water we use, no washing machine etc..when we have heavy rain which now happens more often than previously the water levels raise quickly on the roads around here and the huge increase in traffic and housing is becoming more dangerous for residents.

I am very worried as to future emergencies, I understand new housing is required but surely it should only progress when the infrastructure is ready, the victorian drains are unable to cope with the high increase in the rapidly increasing volume of sewage. This is why I object to the increasing rise in building around the village. Surely the first things to be done in planning is to ensure the general basic requirements are ready to manage

the new housing and the increased level of traffic is causing increasing danger in the village with The Street having high levels of speeding where there are areas where traffic cannot pass at the same time.

Your views as made above will be considered before the application is determined.
