Description of works: Demolition of stable block and erection of 7 No dwelling houses comprising 2 No three-bedroom detached bungalows & 5 No four- bedroom two storey detached houses together with associated car parking and landscaping (resubmission following WA/20/24/PL). This application is a Departure from the Development Plan, falls partly in both Barnham and Walberton parishes and is in CIL Zone 3 and is CIL Liable as new dwellings.

Thank you for your internet representation made on 14th April 2025 which has been recorded as an objection with the comments as follows:

the state of the road and existing infrastructure is collapsing, sink holes keep reoccurring, flooding is already a severe issue needing 24 hour pumping tanks for months during the rainy season. The pump trucks running 24/7 are a pollution and inconvenience to local existing residents. With more housing, less area for water run off and more people using the roads, the area and infrastructure cannot cope.

Existing Residents houses have already been destroyed by flooding and struggle to get insurance that's affordable -if at all.

the original neighbourhood plan said the underground shifting sand would not facilitate any heavy traffic unless their was major work done to the road, which, given the amount of pot holes and disintergrating road surface, does not appear to have been completed.

West Sussex highways have continued to not maintain the road gullies despite the supposed 2 year cyclic cleaning schedual, the road gullies hadnt even been maintained when the schedual was 4 yearly so residents lack confidence in believing the 2 yearly cycle will occur. Local residents have even requested for maintainance and these requests appear to have been ignored.

More worryingly, southern water have already objected and said no to further connections so how is this even up for discussion?

With the aforementioned not addressed, repaired and maintained, and without the essential infrastructure such as sewage plumbing (which has been refused by southern water so one must ask what the intention

here is?) this development would fall short of grampian law and should therefore; be refused by both the local council and the overall governing body that over rules councils when they refuse and developers take it higher.

Your views as made above will be considered before the application is determined.
